To qualify: must be between the ages of 18 and 44 years old, US citizen or permanent US resident, resident of Pennsylvania, have no or limited health insurance, are not pregnant, and meet the income guidelines set by this program. To enroll: visit any Adagio Health location or other family planning providers (call 1-866-520-9139 for nearest location). Documentation: Social Security card, Birth certificate or passport, PA driver's license or state-issued photo ID; proof of income, if self-employed bring a copy of tax returns and your insurance card if you have health insurance. Several AIDS service providers in the Greater Pittsburgh Area came together in collaboration to improve the delivery of service to consumers, to do a regional Needs Assessment and Regional Strategic Service Planning in the eleven counties designated by the Department of Health as Southwestern Pennsylvania.

### **History of Organization**

The Federal Government identified SIDS as a cause worthy of special attention through several pieces of legislation, including the Sudden Infant Death Syndrome Act of 1974. This act fixed the responsibility of SIDS research upon the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development and designated the establishment of counseling programs through the Office of Maternal and Child Health-now and the Maternal and Child Health Bureau (MCHB). Public Law 96-142 enacted in 1979, established a national clearinghouse for the dissemination of information on SIDS to health care professionals, community service personnel, SIDS parents and the general public. Pursuant to the congressional mandate, the National SIDS/Infant Death Resource Center (originally the National SIDS Clearinghouse) has provided information services, educational materials, and technical assistance to those affected by a SIDS diagnosis. With the direction of MCHB in the mid-90's, NSIDRC has broadened its emphasis to include other infant death.

**MULTIFAMILY RENTAL HOUSING:** Affordable rental housing programs offer development sponsors financing from a wide variety of sources: PHFA general fund set-asides; the sale of Agency-issued securities; federal HOME dollars; and, the allocation of housing tax credits. Restrictions and application deadlines vary among programs.

**Construction Loan Program:** Makes below-market rate construction loans available to sponsors of rental housing developments who have permanent take-out financing from other lenders. At least 20 percent of the facility's residents must have incomes that do not exceed 80 percent of the area's median income.

**Housing Tax Credit Program:** Provides owners of and investors in affordable rental

housing developments with federal tax credits that offer a dollar-for-dollar reduction in their tax liability. The credit may be taken for up to ten years. Tax credits are usually sold to investors with the proceeds used to cover development costs.

**PennHOMES Program:** Offers interest-free deferred payment loans to support development of affordable rental housing for residents who meet income guidelines. Can be structured as primary or secondary mortgage loans. Eligible sponsors include individuals, joint ventures, partnerships, limited partnerships, trusts and corporations, and may be for-profit or nonprofit entities. Funding is limited and applicants are encouraged to make maximum use of other public and private financial resources.

**Keystone Home Loan PLUS Program:** Families with children or persons with disabilities who are buying their first home are offered an even lower interest rate with no origination fee. The income and purchase price limits are lower than those of the Keystone Home Loan Program. Available with conventional, FHA, VA, and RHS loan types.

**Keystone Home Loan Program:** Provides residential mortgage loans to qualifying homebuyers who meet certain income and purchase price guidelines. Features below-market interest rates and origination fees. Loans are made through participating lending institutions across the Commonwealth and can be used to purchase both new or existing homes. Available in conjunction with conventional, FHA, VA, and RHS loan types.

**Keystone HOMEstead: Downpayment and Closing Cost Assistance Loan Program** Made in conjunction with PHFA first mortgages, HOMEstead loans provide non-interest bearing second mortgages for downpayments and closing costs. Loans range from \$1,000 to \$35,000. HOMEstead funds in an amount up to \$14,999 are forgiven at a rate of 20 percent per year over five years. Funds between \$15,000 and \$35,000 are forgiven at a rate of ten percent per year over ten years. HOMEstead loans are not available in all areas of the Commonwealth and are limited to borrowers with incomes at or below 80 percent of the area median income. Also, the property must meet federal housing quality standards.

**Keystone Access Home Modification Program:** Offers persons with disabilities, or households with a disabled family member, no interest accessibility modification loans of between \$1,000 and \$10,000 in conjunction with PHFA first mortgage financing. Repayment is not required as long as the borrower occupies the home.

**Keystone Access Downpayment and Closing Cost Assistance Loan Program:** Mortgage loans are provided in conjunction with the Keystone Access Home Modification Program for persons with disabilities, or households with a disabled family member, who are not eligible for the HOMEstead program and need downpayment and closing cost assistance. This program provides deferred payment loans up to \$15,000 without interest. Loans become due and payable upon the sale, transfer, refinance, payoff of the first mortgage, or non-owner occupancy of the property.

**Keystone Purchase-Improvement Program:** Allows borrowers to make up to \$15,000 in

home improvements in conjunction with the purchase of a home with an Agency first mortgage loan. This can include repairs, alterations, or modifications to improve the basic livability, energy efficiency, or safety of the property. The As-Complete Appraised Value must support the cost of the repairs.

**PENNVEST On-Lot Sewage System Loans:** Provide up to \$25,000 for 20-year, very low interest rate loans to homeowners for the repair or upgrade of malfunctioning on-lot sewage systems. These loans are insured under the FHA Title I Home Improvement Loan Program.

**FORECLOSURE PREVENTION:** The Homeowners Emergency Mortgage Assistance Program provides short-term, temporary funding to cure mortgage delinquencies. Mortgage payments are made to lenders on behalf of qualifying homeowners for up to 24 months. Recipients must meet eligibility guidelines defined in state law (Act 91). To secure the mortgage loan, HEMAP places a lien against the homeowners property and repayment is required.

Motor Carrier Services/Enforcement Division: The four District Offices - located in Harrisburg, Philadelphia, Scranton, and Pittsburgh regularly inspect and audit companies to ensure that trucks, buses, taxis, and limousines comply with the Public Utility Code and Commission regulations. The Divisions Compliance Office reviews the work of the district offices and prepares all informal and formal enforcement actions. This unit also processes all uncontested motor carrier applications. The Insurance Filing Unit processes motor carrier tariff filings and ensures that all motor carriers operating in Pennsylvania maintain appropriate insurance.

**Rail Safety Division:** The Rail Safety Division is responsible for rail crossing and bridge safety. It monitors compliance with the Federal Railroad Administrations track, operating practice and freight car standards. It reviews and approves the acquisition of railroad property; the abandonment of branch lines; the abandonment and curtailment of passenger service; and the safety of clearances. It also monitors the safety needs at crossings, including the proper installation and operation of flashing lights and gates. Companies must receive permission by the Commission to construct, alter, relocate, suspend or abolish a rail/highway crossing. There are approximately 5,000 bridges and 7,500 grade crossings in the state under PUC jurisdiction.

**Gas Safety Division:** The gas utilities serve over 2 million natural gas customers in urban and rural territories. The pipelines include transmission lines, main lines, service lines, regulator stations, compressor stations and gas meter installations. Inspections deal with operation, maintenance, damage prevention, emergency response and drug and alcohol misuse prevention programs. They include reviews of company records along with field inspections of the physical facilities to identify safety violations. Depending on the seriousness of a violation, penalties may range from a notice of violation requiring corrective action to a formal investigation resulting in a fine. The Gas Safety Division, through an agreement with the federal Department of Transportations Office of Pipeline Safety, enforces the federal gas pipeline safety regulations and the Commissions own gas safety regulations.

Behavioral Health Rehabilitation Service--this program provides treatment to a child in their natural environment, including the home, school and community. A treatment team is comprised of one or more of the following: Behavioral Specialist Consultant, Mobile Therapist, and Therapeutic Staff Support. This team develops a treatment plan to meet the specific needs of the child and the family. Behavioral Health Rehabilitation Services require psychological evaluation to determine eligibility. The Stern Center will conduct this evaluation or if you have an evaluation that already determines need, you may contact them to set up an appointment.

Strengths-Based Therapy--this program is similar to Behavioral Health Rehabilitation Services but only provides one Mobile Therapist, for in the home, school and community. The Strengths-Based Therapist can begin services with a psychological evaluation or from a Strengths-Based Assessment, conducted over a two-week observation for a determination of need. Though service is less intensive and takes a more positive outlook in the treatment planning, the Strengths-Based Therapist also includes a case management element to assist in networking for the client and family.

Outpatient Therapy--provides individual, group, family and couples therapy covering a wide range of topics including anxiety disorders, depression, sexual, physical and mental abuse, anger management, addictions and other mental health disorders. This service is offered for both adults and children.

Family Based Therapy--provides short-term, intensive, in-home services designed to meet the needs of children, adolescents (ages 0-21) and their families who have experienced trauma and/or abuse. An evaluation conducted by a licensed psychologist or physician that prescribes Family Based Mental Health Services is needed for services to begin.

Psychiatric Services--are provided in the Connellsville Office. Dr. Ahmed Jahangeer, MD (a psychiatrist specializing in child and adolescent psychiatry) provides initial evaluation and ongoing medication management for individuals currently enrolled in outpatient services, family based services, strengths-based, or behavioral health rehabilitation services with the Stern Center.

Parent/Children Interaction Therapy--is a program in which parenting skills can be learned through counseling and observation using a two way mirror and parental coaching through the assistance of a trained and credentialed therapist.

It is recommended that an in-patient program has been completed within the last twelve months. The most important pre-requisite is the willingness to eat and follow a food plan of healthy eating. Exercise is moderate - usually walking to meetings within the community. Medical support and evaluations with a dietician are required.

Julie's House-- This is a specialized program for pregnant women and women with babies up to twelve months of age. It is a six month program. Each mother and child will be in a beautifully furnished apartment. Our new mothers will receive education on child care and be able to continue their drug and alcohol recovery through individual sessions and group therapy. This will be supplemented by educational groups on life skills, boundaries and budgeting. Relapse prevention will be an integral part of the program. Our goal is to support continued recovery for families and to assist in ending the cycle of addiction
